Impact report 2018/19

People pushed towards poverty

With the closure of a large number of local authority welfare schemes, the vital safety net for many has disappeared. This leaves them in challenging situations, without access to the most basic items necessary for a safe and comfortable home life.

That is why we award small one-off grants for essential household items and clothing. We make no restrictions on who we award our grants to, so long as they are legally resident in the UK.

Working with our partners

During 2018/19, we worked with:

1,150 partner agencies across the UK

including housing associations, citizens advice bureaux, probation services and other charities



2,982 support workers submitted applications to us

Meet Peter

When Peter was released from jail he had no home to go to. With little family support, Peter ended up in a homeless night shelter, before being allocated a council flat. I desperately needed a washing machine but couldn't afford one. At first I went to the laundrette, but with my health issues, getting there became impossible, so I started washing my clothes in the bath.

Sadly, Peter's situation is not unique. Thousands of people need a bit of extra help to enable them to live a comfortable and productive life. In 2018/19, we supported 11,520 people who were financially vulnerable, living with poor mental or physical health, experiencing domestic violence or homeless.

Last year Framework Housing Association support worker Mike McMahon applied for a grant on behalf of Hameera who was living in Lincoln with mental health issues. Hameera rebuilt her life and was allocated a new council flat, but had no means to furnish it.

A cooker was high on the priority list if Hameera was going to be supported to live a healthy, independent life. With no means to buy one, Mike turned to Glasspool for help.






Making an application with Glasspool is easy and straightforward. The team are always very prompt with answering any questions. It's a really good system.

Extending our impact

We know that by working with partner agencies, people receive packages of support which extend the impact of our grants. These agencies provide a range of practical and emotional support that helps people stabilise their lives and move forward.

One of these organisations is Foundations First, a partnership between Shelter Scotland and Renfrewshire Council, set up to support children and their families in Renfrewshire.

The families they help are either homeless or worrying about losing their home. They are often struggling financially or in rent arrears. Many live in poor housing conditions including overcrowding.
